Mayor Of Hailsham Welcomes New Town Councillor

Hailsham Town Council is pleased to announce that they have co-opted a new town councillor in its search to fill a vacancy in the Upper Horsebridge ward.

Jack Hulbert of Park Close was welcomed as the newest member of the Council at a meeting on Monday evening [4th October], following a vote in public by councillors. His co-option to the Council now brings the membership back to twenty four town councillors.

Describing himself as a concerned citizen, retired Registered General Nurse Mr Hulbert said, "I've always wanted to become more involved in the community and, now that I've been co-opted on to the Town Council, I will certainly do all I can to make things a bit better in the town."

In terms of local involvement, Mr Hulbert has recently accepted a role in organising the nomination of buildings, structures and townscapes considered to be of historical importance, to add to the 'Local List' that Wealden District Council is currently compiling. The new register will act as supplementary planning guidance, and could help to preserve the buildings and structures in the future.

The Mayor of Hailsham, Councillor Robin Kempe, welcoming Mr Hulbert to the Town Council, said "I am delighted Jack has taken this ward. He was a fine candidate and I am sure he will work hard to improve the quality of life for Hailsham residents and promote close links between the Council and the people it serves."

"I look forward to working with Jack and wish him every success as a town councillor."
