Hailsham Neighbourhood Planning Team Launches New Questionnaire for Residents

Hailsham Town Council's Neighbourhood Planning Team has launched a 4-week consultation questionnaire in which residents can have their say on the emerging ideas and identify priorities for local infrastructure and other provision in the future.

Councillor Glenn Moore, chairman of the Neighbourhood Planning Committee said it is of paramount importance that, through the survey, residents' needs and preferences are taken into account.

Councillor Moore said: "Please do take the time to complete the questionnaire and let us know what you think about the emerging ideas. We will review all responses and prepare a draft neighbourhood plan for consultation later this year."
