

## **COMMUNITY INFRASTRUCTURE LEVY ANNUAL REPORT FOR 2018/2019**

**Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL)** is a charge on new development that is collected by Wealden District Council (WDC) to provide additional funding to help pay for new and improved infrastructure.

Money raised can be spent on anything that deals with the demands that development places on the area.

CIL is charged on each square metre of additional floor space.

Wealden District Council pays Hailsham Town Council 15% of CIL receipts for developments in its area. The CIL funds must be spent on infrastructure necessary to support development planned in the Councils Local Plan.

The Town Council is required by Regulations to publish a formal report on each year's CIL receipts.

The following details relate to the year ended 31<sup>st</sup> March 2019:
