The Friday Night Project (FNP), which is funded by Hailsham Town Council and the Safer Wealden Partnership, works in partnership with organisations such as Hailsham Community College, Sussex Police and Knockhatch to help create alternative recreational activities for young people on Friday evenings and reduce boredom and antisocial behaviour.

Town Mayor Councillor Paul Holbrook commented: "Young people always look forward to Friday evenings and various weekend outings which make up the Friday Night Project and are always keen to take advantage of the many opportunities being offered by our youth project team."
