C. Bryant declared a personal interest in the item discussing the Bonfire Society as he is a member of the Bonfire Society

26 Confirmation of Minutes

28 **999 Day**

There was no update as Councillor Murphy was not present at the meeting

Members agreed to keep the allocated day of Sunday 28th July 2024 aside for the event

29 Stand Proud Event

Councillor M. Laxton addressed the Committee regarding the "Stand Proud" event planned for 2024.

She advised that the event will comprise of a day of activities at the HMI Club in May. The event will run from 1.00 pm to 11.30 pm and will celebrate diversity and equality.

A rainbow theme flag will be placed on the War Memorial and the local shops will be contacted to see if they wish to get involved by organising a rainbow theme in their shop windows.

There will be a sensory and interactive show on the day, a live band and a drag queen and comedians later on in the evening.

Councillor Laxton requested that the Town Council provide £1000 sponsorship towards the event. K. Giddings advised this request for funding will be included in the Costed Report which will be taken to the August Communities Committee meeting for discussion.

M. Laxton requested that the Town Council take charge of the best dressed window competition and organise the placing of the rainbow flag on the War Memorial.

30 <u>10 K Run</u>

M. Laxton reported that the recent 10 K Run had been a huge success, with 500 runners and approximately 1000 people attending the event. A number of individuals with severe disabilities also got involved in the Run. Many community groups also got involved in the event and the Run brought a large amount of business into the Town.

M. Laxton advised that £1,300 profit was made from the Run and this was distributed to the local sports clubs.

B. Pratt stated that he has 11 stalls booked for the market this coming Saturday. He advised that the Farmers' Market allow 2 charity stalls to have a free stall at the market, every month.

40 Hailsham FM

N. Mullery told members that Hailsham FM will be moving premises, from 2 North Street. They will be moving at the end of July.

He reported that they have secured a lease on a new premises in Hailsham and that they will remain broadcasting while they move.

41 Hailsham Parish Church

D. Sinden updated members on the events coming up. A women's "Pimms and Pudding" evening is planned at the Church on 13th July, the Church is currently open on Wednesdays between 12 pm to 2.00 pm, a Men's breakfast will be held at the end of September at B12, the Church will be open as usual after the Christmas Switch On event welcoming visitors with hot drinks, Wealden Brass will play their free concert at the church at 2.30 pm, on Saturday 9th December, the day of the Christmas Market.
