154 **Street Markets**

K. Butcher advised that the first market of the year had just taken place. The market has some new traders with a new Bee Keeper and a new crochet stall.

The "Streets of Hailsham" is returning on 18th May and will be centred around the High Street and will coincide with the Street Market.

155 <u>Hailsham Forward</u>

Members were advised a meeting had recently taken place with Wealden Council and the Chamber of Commerce to further discuss the Hailsham BID.

156 **Soap Box Derby**

K. Butcher addressed the Committee with some ideas for a "Soap Box Derby", to be held Summer 2025, and advised she is looking into possible sponsorship with this and will provide further details to the Committee when more details are available.

157 Christmas Light Switch On 2024

K. Giddings advised that it is planned to have stalls again at the event, to include food stalls, as in 2023.

Extra barriers will be put in place to keep the public safely off the road.

Hailsham Speedway will be contacted to see if they can attend the event.

158 <u>Christmas Market</u>

Members noted the Civic Hall has been booked and will be used alongside the High Street for stalls and entertainment for the Christmas market.

Wealden Council have advised that the main front entrance to the Civic Hall can be left open, providing it is manned at all times. K. Giddings and K. Butcher advised that security will be organised for this. This will allow a main entrance for the public to access the market in the Civic Hall.

Sussex Stompers have been booked for the event and will be situated in the Civic Hall.

Vadars Radars have also been booked and can cover both sites

Hailsham Choral Society will be approached to see if they are available to sing at both sites.

Volunteers were requested to help with organising tea and coffee (which will be free) and possibly hot chocolate, mulled wine and mince pies (which will be purchased for a small charge) in the Civic Hall.

It was agreed to again organise the Parade from the High Street to the Farmers' Market (weather permitting).

B. Pratt advised he will be speaking to the Farmers' Market Board to discuss the Farmers' Market possibly joining the Christmas market in the Civic Hall, only in the event of bad weather.

D. Chapman advised he is standing down as Chair of the Society. He further advised the Bonfire Societies AGM would take place that evening.
